

GROUNDS FOR DENIAL OF ASSISTANCE FOR AN APPLICANT/PARTICIPANT

- 1. The Town of Union's denial of assistance for an applicant may include:
 - deny listing on waiting list
 - denial or withdrawal of a Housing Choice Voucher
 - refuse to enter into a Housing Assistance Payments Contract
 - refuse to process or provide portability
 - denial of admission preferences to the family



- 2. The Town may deny assistance for the following reasons:
 - If any member of the family has been evicted from federally assisted housing for serious violations of the lease i.e. money owed to a PHA, family member(s) involved in drug related or violent criminal related activities.
 - If family violates any family obligations.
 - If a PHA has ever terminated assistance under the Certificate or Voucher Programs for any family member.
 - If the family owes or has not reimbursed any PHA for amounts paid to an owner under a HAP Contract for rent, damages or other amounts owed by the family under the lease.
 - If a family member has engaged in or threatened abusive or violent behavior toward PHA personnel.
- 3. The Town must deny assistance for the following reasons:
 - If the family does not submit evidence of citizenship or eligible immigration status.
 - If any member of the family fails to sign and submit consent forms for obtaining continuing eligibility factor verification.
- 4. The Town must permanently deny admission for the following reason:
 - Any family member convicted of manufacturing or producing methamphetamine (speed) in violation of any Federal, State or Local Law.
