The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide a substantial infusion of resources to help turn the tide on the pandemic, address its economic fallout, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery.

Town of Union Final ARPA Funding Allocation:
\$30,477,638.00

Traunch (Payment) 1: \$15,238,819.00 Received 6/28/2021

Traunch (Payment) 2: \$15,238,819.00 To be Requested in Future

Funds must be obligated or encumbered by December 31, 2024.

All funds must be spent by December 31, 2026, which provides recipients a reasonable amount of time to complete projects funded with Fiscal Recovery Funds.

Revenue Loss

- A portion of the funds goes to covering the lost revenue from 2020-2021 due to the pandemic.
- The remaining funds are then eligible for use based on pre-defined ARPA categories.
- While, the revenue loss does provide for greater flexibility in spending, the Town is using it as an opportunity to tackle some key priorities that may not have been funded otherwise.

American Rescue Plan (ARPA)

Activity/Project Priority Considerations

1. Would the Town spend money on the activity or project if ARPA funds were not available?
2. Is it an activity or project that the Town would typically undertake through the annual budget process or capital plan?
3. Does the activity or project provide a return that reduces operational spending?
4. Does the project create opportunity to expand the Town's tax base or make the Town more attractive for future development?
5. Is there a regulatory or compliance issue that is addressed through the expenditure of ARPA funds?
6. Does the activity or project acknowledge that ARPA funds are one-time investments and should be spent in such a way to avoid recurring costs?
7. To the extent practicable, does the expenditure of ARPA funds for an activity or project achieve long-lasting benefits and results?
8. Does the activity or project promote long-term fiscal and environmental sustainability?
9. Can the activity or project be completed within the expenditure deadline requirements of ARPA?
