TOWN OF UNION BOARD MEETING

December 21, 2016

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Union was held on Wednesday, December 21, 2016 at 7:30 P.M. in the Town Board Room, 3111 East Main Street, Endwell, New York.

<u>BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT</u>: Supervisor Rose A. Sotak, Councilman Thomas R. Augostini, Councilman Frank J. Bertoni, Councilman Leonard J. Perfetti, Councilman Robert Mack.

<u>TOWN OFFICIALS PRESENT</u>: Town Attorney Alan J. Pope, Town Clerk Gail L. Springer, Deputy Town Clerk Rebecca Kruczkowski.

Also in attendance was Giuseppe Roberto, Zoning Board of Appeals member.

Supervisor Rose A. Sotak opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Moved by Augostini, seconded by Bertoni to approve the Minutes of the Regular Town of Union Board meeting held on Wednesday, December 7, 2016. Carried.

HEARING OF VISITORS:

Paul Gonzalez, 508 June Street, Endicott, asked where the money is the County received from the flood for the Grippen Park Ice Rink and why it was not used to rebuild it. He further asked if money from CDBG can be used to build a skating rink in the Town of Union.

Councilman Frank J. Bertoni said the money was used for the Broome County Arena. He said a plan under County Executive Debbie Preston's administration for a skating rink was presented to the Town.



Councilman Thomas R. Augostini said CDBG money can be used for a skating rink but it cannot be at the Grippen Park facility.

Councilman Leonard J, Perfetti said the Town will have to work with the incoming administration to follow up on the plan that was presented.

Mr. Gonzalez asked how to go about getting a freezer picked up from his daughter's house.

Supervisor Rose A. Sotak said he would have to call the Refuse Department to schedule a pick up and the freezer must be at the curb with the door off.

Mitch Curatolo, 1010 Autumn Drive, Endwell, complained again about the property on Watson Boulevard by the Polar Shot driving range. He said there are numerous vehicles parked there with for sale signs on them and asked why this is being allowed and if they have to have permits to sell them there.

Councilman Robert Mack said Code Enforcement was informed.

Town Attorney Alan J. Pope said he will alert Deputy Commissioner of Public Works for Codes and Ordinances Daria Golazeski again of the situation.

John Longo, 437 Country Knoll Drive, Endwell, said he and his neighbor have been trying to resolve an issue with the Town regarding a sewer drain between their properties that is sinking. They believe that through an easement many years ago, the Town of Union owns it.

Town Attorney Alan J. Pope explained that the Town Engineering Office has reviewed all the easements on file with the Town and no easement has been found for 441 Country Knoll Drive. He suggested they have their attorney review their abstracts and contact him. He also said the Town has twice offered to repair the sewer drain and both times the offer was refused.

Lisa Wolf, 441 Country Knoll Drive, Endwell, presented to Town Clerk Gail L. Springer her Abstract of Title for her property at 441 Country Knoll Drive for Town Attorney Alan J. Pope to review for any said easements.

Mr. Longo asked if the Town owns the property, how can he sign the one-time offer contract from the Town of union to fix the sewer drain.

Town Attorney Alan J. Pope said an easement for a property down the street is on file but nothing for theirs.

As no one else wished to speak, Supervisor Rose A. Sotak closed the first Hearing of Visitors.
