## TOWN OF UNION BOARD MEETING

#### May 1, 2019

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Union was held on Wednesday, May 1, 2019 at 7:00 P.M. in the Town Board Room, 3111 East Main Street, Endwell, New York.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**:

A Public Hearing was called for on Wednesday, May 1, 2019 at 7:00 P.M. to consider amending Chapter 300, Section 52, entitled Sign Regulations and Article 70 Definitions of the Town of Union Code.

Resolution to declare the proposed amendment of Article 52 of the Town of Union Zoning Code regarding the regulation of signs a type 1 Action under SEQRA and to determine said proposed action to be a Negative Declaration under SEQRA after evaluation of the applicable Environmental Assessment Form.

The Resolution was adopted.

(Prepared Resolution filed as part of these minutes authorizing the Supervisor to enter into an agreement with Hulbert Engineering & Land Surveying, DPC, 53 Chenango Street, 8<sup>th</sup> Floor, Binghamton, New York 13901, in an amount not to exceed \$21,306.00 for the base design of the Fairmont Park Water Distribution System Improvement Project. Surveys and legal descriptions required for potential permanent easements are not included in the base design cost and, if required, will be billed separately at \$1,785 per property. The RFP scope indicated the potential for 5-6 permanent easements. The cost of this project is not CDBG or CDBG-DR eligible. The Town Board will need to designate the source of funds to pay for the project in the approval resolution before contracts can be executed.) Res. by Bertoni, seconded by Staley. Vote: All yes. The Resolution was adopted.

At this time, Councilman Frank J. Bertoni clarified that only this part of the project is not qualified for CDBG or CDBG-DR funding.

Moved by Bertoni, seconded by Staley to authorize the Planning Department to accept and approve the late application from Meals on Wheels of Western Broome for FFY 2019 CDBG funding.

Carried.

The Resolution was adopted.

At this time, Supervisor Richard A. Materese said although the Board feels for Meals on Wheels, it is the Town Policy that any application filed late is subject to the 10% reduction in funding and that is why the Board voted as they did.

## HEARING OF VISITORS:

Carol Laskoski, 37 Edwards Street, Johnson City, asked the Board to clarify what CDBG funding is and what it is used for, and to also explain the difference between a motion and a resolution for the benefit of the students in attendance.

Councilman Thomas R. Augostini explained the Community Development Block Grant funding and what it can be used for.

Supervisor Richard A. Materese also explained that CDBG funding can be used for programs benefitting the low income, youth or elderly, such as the Boys & Girls Club of Western Broome and Senior Citizens Centers, not only for building or infrastructure projects.

Town Attorney Alan J. Pope explained the differences between a motion and a resolution.

As no one else wished to speak, Supervisor Richard A. Materese closed the second Hearing of Visitors.
